This is the story of Rose (Rosie) Lawrence Peters, a daughter of one of the large Tassajara Valley families that came from the Azores in the mid 1860s. Her parents met where they worked on the Wood Ranch in Sycamore Valley. They share-cropped, then purchase land in Tassajara Valley. Rose overcame hardship, became literate, was of strong character, and registered to vote as soon as she could in 1912.

Beverly Lane, curator of the San Ramon Valley Museum, local historian, author, and President of the East Bay Regional Park District Board will be our moderator.

Betty Mattos Casey, a direct descendent of another Azore family that came to America with little or no money or education will play the part of Rose Lawrence Peters.
