“Crafting Your Google Search”

Use Google’s Powerful search Engines to Identify Relevant
Genealogy Databases for Your Ancestral Research

Livermore resident, Kay Speaks, has been a L-AGS member since 1999. Recently Kay was the grand opening guest speaker for the Tulare county Museum in Visalia, California. Their first museum exhibit featured the influence of the Chinese farmer laborer in Tulare County. The exhibit coincided with Tulare County’s 50th World Agricultural Expo represented by 49 US states and 49 countries. Speaks’ Chinese grandfather and great-uncle owned farm land and were vegetable farmers in rural Visalia. Kay will demonstrate Google research techniques used to identify historical records for Tulare County residents who were born in China. Kay plans to compile her research results into book format. A simple ethnic and location search produced surprising and very rewarding results! Some were not found in popular genealogy published databases.
