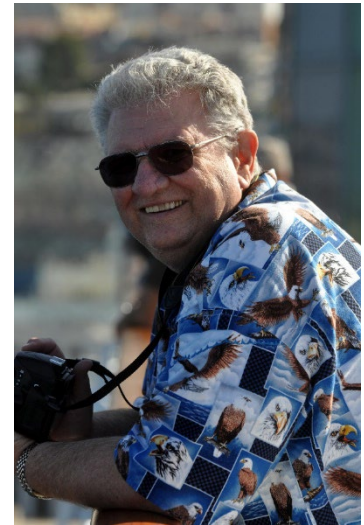

Researching Mayflower Ancestors

Robert “Bob” Trapp, former governor of the Mayflower Society, Alameda Colony, will present the stories of the Mayflower and Speedwell landings and how he was able to find out about his Mayflower ancestors.

Robert “Bob” Trapp, a 3rd generation Californian, was born in Hayward but grew up in Southern California. He was first introduced to family history by his grandparents, who told him stories of their lives and ancestors. As a member of the Mayflower Society, Alameda Colony, he has served as Deputy and Colony Governor and is currently serving the Colony as Co-Membership Chair. His research has taken him to England and the Netherlands. His U.S. research has taken him from New England to the deep south and back to California. He claims 26 Mayflower passengers as ancestors, as well as one from Jamestown and many early Pennsylvania Quakers. He is a longtime member of the California Genealogical Society and has presented at its seminars and to other organizations around the Bay Area. He is a longtime volunteer at the Oakland Family Search Library/Center and has shared several family history booklets with family members at home and abroad. He is also a member of New England Historic Genealogical Society.
